# What would you say worked well leading the We R Native (WRN) Program?



#### Facilitator Feedback:

- Revised curriculum was easy to use teaching topics not taught at school
- The added cultural components
- Good internet accessibility at school
- Partnered with youth work program

"I showed videos from We R Native about how to put the condoms on. They said they've always heard to wear a condom but no one told them how to put them on."

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"Games opened them up—participated more and less side conversations going on—gave a competitiveness to it."

More flexibility with implementing sessions

# How would you describe the youth participants' level of engagement over the course of the We R Native program?





Engagement was highest when receiving new information during activities and learning/experiencing cultural components

Engagement was lowest when youth knew the material and when there was too much paperwork

Strengthen Youth-Facilitator Relationships

"What We R Native does is it passes the torch-It doesn't always end with trauma and hurt it starts with you. They can impact themselves and their own community. That they can make a change" "Couple kids in [program] that are lingering on the side of bully. Not that they're a straight out a bully but they've said that they've watched that. [They] noted that they can say things that bother their classmates. [They're} more aware of how they respond to people and how they act."

"When we set group rules we worked by the 7 grandfather teachings, [we] wanted to include those values. So we would reflect on that in every lessons and we would read over what each of the grandfather teachings meant"

"For the stand strong lesson we had them decorate a feather—good positive things about themselves. Put them on the wall and they looked like angel winds and then kids took pictures of themselves with the wings behind"
