


FY17-FY21 PRE- AND POST-TEST SURVEY RESULTS

Youth participants completed a pre-program and postprogram survey that asked questions about their life, relationships, and personal decisions. Some questions asked about how they may think, feel or act in certain situations. Their combined responses are reported on pages 2 & 3. 



YOUTH WERE ASKED HOW LIKELY THEY WOULD BE ABLE TO DO THE FOLLOWING IF A PARTNER WANTED TO HAVE SEX AND THEY DID NOT:

"Stick to my decision to not have sex" "Talk to my partner about my decision" "Avoid getting into a situation that might lead to sex" "Say 'NO' and explain my reason" "Stop seeing my partner if they kept pushing me to have sex" "Talk to a trusted adult"



Preventing STDs/ STIs, HIV/ AIDS, & Pregnancy



Youth participants responded to questions about their personal sexual history and how they protected themselves from pregnancy, STDs/STIs & HIV/AIDS. Youth participants could skip any questions they did not want to answer. Their combined responses are reported on pages 4-7 of this report.

REASONS YOUTH REPORTED CHOOSING NOT TO USE CONTRACEPTIVES DURING SEXUAL INTERCOURSE









Youth Strengths and Assets (Mean)








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YOUTH WERE ASKED ABOUT THEIR KNOWLEDGE AND PARTICIPATION OF TRADITIONAL/ CEREMONIAL TOBACCO USE

YOUTH WERE ASKED HOW MUCH THEY KNEW ABOUT THEIR NATIVE AMERICAN CULTURE AND IF THEY WANTED TO LEARN MORE



FEEDBACK

During the post-test, the youth were asked questions about their experience with the 'We R Native' program to evaluate how, if at all, attending the program affected them.



91% of youth reported that they were more likely to use condoms or other barrier methods when engaging in sexual activity to prevent spreading of STDs/ STIs or HIV/AIDS



88% of youth reported that they were more likely to use condoms and/ or contraception when having sex to prevent pregnancy



91% of youth reported that they were more knowledgeable about the methods to prevent pregnancy until they are ready to start a family later in life



88% of youth reported that they were knowledgeable about the methods to prevent the spreading of STDs/ STIs or HIV/AIDS



86% of youth reported that they had a better understanding of how sex can affect their health – including mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual health
