The partnership for Anishnaabe Binoojiinyensag seeks to address persistent disparities in maternal, infant, and early childhood health and social indicators among American Indian (AI) populations through delivery of Home Visiting services.

Home Visitors:

- Want to help families be healthy and well
- Do not perform drug screens
- Can help families identify and navigate relevant community resources
- Can be an essential part of the support team throughout pregnancy and after birth
- Can provide education and support for self-care and the care of children
- Can support families in providing a loving and stable home environment with connection to native language and culture

Naloxone/Narcan is a medicine that can reverse opioid overdose.

It is easy and legal for anyone to possess and administer this medicine.

Anyone can be trained to administer Naloxone/Narcan.
